In addition to her many duties for the Cape Fear Aquatic Club Devin has also been an active part in the Wilmington Swim Community. She has been the head coach of the Wilmington YMCA's Summer Swim Team, the YMCA Narwhals for the last two years. She has also run several week-long swim camps for age group swimmers to experience what swim team is like before making the summer or year-long commitment to the sport. Devin works closely with the director of swim lessons through the Y to make sure that swimmers have the prerequisite skills required to transition successfully to swim team. There is currently a swimmer on the CFAC team whose mother is battling an extremely rare form of breast cancer. The family has recently been chosen to be the recipient of a local fundraiser. Devin is working with the CFAC's parent board to coordinate his teammates being there, fundraising and showing their support by participating in the fundraiser. Devin has promoted swimming through the connections she has made with swim families both on the team she coaches as well as the other teams in the Wilmington area. She is always willing to reach out and talk to both swimmers and parents. She uses the connections she has made through her own swim career as a YMCA national swimmer as well as an NCAA All-American to improve the swimming career of others. She is always willing to reach out to teams if a swimmer is moving, or she needs assistance. Devin is also able to bring the joy of swim to our local area through the use of social media. CLUB LEADERSHIP

As a parent from a different team told me recently, "Devin is the best thing to happen to Wilmington swimming in 15 years." Devin makes a day to day difference with her swimmers by forming meaningful relationships with her swimmers and their parents. Her goal is for every swimmer to get better and this will happen by making swimming fun. Devin is a hands-on coach. She will get in the water with each group of swimmers at least once a week. She works one on one with the swimmers on technique. She also teaches swimmers strategies that will make them better races. Devin supports her swimmers in and outside the pool. She believes that swim is only one aspect of their lives. She goes to their other activities, she celebrates their triumphs and she helps them to develop plans to move on when they have setbacks. When the head coach of CFAC unexpectedly resigned in May, Devin stepped forward and single-handedly ran all aspects of the team. Devin took on full coaching duties including the organization of schedule, parent communication, team bonding and continuation of swimmer development. In addition, she also coached the YMCA summer swim team to its best season in the 6-year history of the team.
