# NCS SWIMMERS ROLLED UP THE RED CARPET WINNING THE SOUTHERN ZONE AGE GROUP CHAMPIONSHIP SWIM MEET FOR THE THIRD YEAR IN A ROW

The NCS ZONE TEAM continued its dominance in the pool on the final two days of competition. On Friday, the NCS squad had 30 finals swims and 44 swims (a record) in finals on Saturday evening. Both days NCS had more finals swims than all of the other participating teams.

On Friday evening, new Futures qualifying swims were attained by Taylor Klein (14F-1:05.86-100m Back); Maria Champion (13F-1:05.86-100m Back); Albert Smelzer (14M-1:00.01-100m Back); Santiago Alzate (14M-4:08.57-400m Free); and Charlotte LePage (15F-4:27.16-400m Free). Not to be outdone, NCS swimmers continued to collect Futures cuts on Saturday evening when the following NCS athletes slid under the Futures cut—Maria Champion (13F-2:23.12-200 IM); Tia Ormondroyd (15F-2:25.97-200 IM); and Michael Rice (14M-24.72-50m Free). Albert Smelzer repeated his AG Champs performance attaining the Summer Junior cut in the 50m Free winning the event in a time of 23.97. Later that evening he would lead off the relay in 23.79 lowering the State Record he had set two weeks earlier.

Our NCS sprint relays continued to swim strong as well. In Friday's finals, the 13-14 Girls [Klein (31.22), Crane (35.83); Talwar (28.43) and Howard (27.14)] and the 13-14 Boys [Smelzer (27.46), Townsend (32.70), James (26.36) and Rice (24.39) both took first place in their respective 200m Medley Relays. On Saturday, NCS recorded three wins in the 200m Free Relays by the 11-12 Girls team [Brock (28.12), He (27.81), Liu (28.17); and O'Malley (28.02), the 15-18 Girls team of [Goodwin (no split), LePage (no split), Nugent (no split), and A. Mast (no split); and the 13-14 Boys team [Smelzer (23.79), Tuescher (24.92), Rice (24.57); and Alzate (25.67)].

The team returned to the hotel victorious and to a taco fiesta and ice cream sundae bar. As NCS now holds the 2022 Champions title, this marks the ninth time NCS has won the Zone Championship since it was first held in Dallas in 1980. Other wins were in 1990, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2016, 2019 and 2021.


